J.D. CONCENTRATION IN NATIONAL SECURITY & U.S. FOREIGN RELATIONS LAW

As described in the GW Law Bulletin, J.D. candidates may earn a Recognition of J.D. Concentration in National Security & U.S. Foreign Relations Law by successfully completing (*i.e.*, receiving a grade of C- or better) 14 credits of National Security & U.S. Foreign Relations Law courses (listed in the practice area in the Bulletin), including two required courses—National Security Law (6870) and U.S. Foreign Relations Law (6871)—and two credits graded on the basis of a research paper that meets the standards for the Law School's legal writing requirement, either written in conjunction with one of the "Foundation" or "Advanced" courses in the practice area or with advance approval of the program director, written for a journal, independent legal writing, or a course that is not included in the "Foundation" or "Advanced" course list or on a national security and U.S. foreign relations law topic. Up to two credits earned through a national security-related Field Placement (6668) may count toward the Concentration credits, with approval of the program director. Note: students cannot obtain concentrations in both National Security & U.S. Foreign Relations Law and International & Comparative Law. Students cannot obtain Concentrations in both National Security & U.S. Foreign Relations Law and National Security & Cybersecurity Law.
